Rural Improvement Zone: The Rural Improvement Zone referred to as RIZ allows the tax generated by improvements that increase the valuations to property within the Holiday Lake area to be set aside and used for improvements to the lake and the surrounding area for conservation (not for roads). The funds are requested and administered by a Board of Trustees who are elected by full-time residents of the Holiday Lake Subdivision.

Important Information

Weather Sirens

- When there is severe weather moving into our area, we are notified by one or several agencies: Poweshiek County Sheriff's Department, National Weather Service, Emergency Management Service, NOAA Radio.
- We have two sirens that will be activated when we are notified of a Severe Thunderstorm Warning or a Tornado Warning only. One siren is located on North Lakeshore in Unit 5 and the other is located on Holiday Lane in Unit 1.
- Sirens are for outside use only. Please purchase a NOAA Radio for inside.
- Safety tips to follow in case warnings are sounded:
 - The sirens are for the safety of everyone, so please do not go outside to see what is happening.
 - Go to the lowest point of your home such as a basement or under a stairway for your protection.
 - If you do not have a basement, go to a closet or bathroom and try to stay away from windows.
 - Kneel down on the floor and cover your head with either a blanket or pillows to protect yourself from injury.
 - Keep a flashlight, portable radio, and extra batteries on hand and in a place which is easy to get to in case of an emergency.

Owners Responsibility(ies)

All Holiday Lake property/lot owners are responsible/accountable for any and/or all guest(s) invited to Holiday Lake by yourself and/or family member(s). Your responsibility/accountability includes said guest(s) behaviors/actions on all Holiday Lake common grounds: roads, park(s), campgrounds, beach, docks, and water (boating, fishing, skiing-tubing, swimming).

Erosion/Water Flow Control

As you are doing yard work, please clean out culverts and ditches you have along your Holiday Lake property(ies). It is extremely important to keep culverts and ditches free of any waste materials, whether from construction, yard waste, Mother Nature's seasonal doing, or general debris, to ensure that natural drainage and waterway areas remain open. Cleaning out the culverts and ditches around your property(ies) will be so very helpful with the ongoing efforts to assist with erosion control at our lake.

911 Sign

The Poweshiek County Sheriff's Office has requested that all lot owners have a 911 sign. Not only are the signs helpful during an emergency, they can assist your family and friends in finding your lot. 911 signs can be purchased/ordered for \$25.00 each through the Holiday Lake Office during normal business hours.

If you observe any suspicious or mischievous behavior within the Holiday Lake Subdivision, please contact the Poweshiek County Sheriff and your unit director, as soon as possible, to file a report.

Composting of Yard Waste

The composting site in Unit 4, off Shady Lane Drive, will be open every Saturday (weather permitting) from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Composting began April 8, 2017, and will continue through November 4, 2017. Materials accepted will be branches (no larger than 3 inches in diameter) and any biodegradable yard waste (grass clippings and plant debris). This site will be monitored while open. When not open, the gate will be locked. Any violations will be subject to a \$500.00 corporate assessment.

RED FLAG ALERT

When a Red Flag is in place of the American Flag on the dam, and at the North and South boat docks, this is to signify there is to be NO WAKE on the lake – due to high water.

BLACK FLAG ALERT

When a Black Flag is in place of the American Flag on the dam, and at the North and South boat docks, this means NO MOTORIZED recreational vehicles are allowed on the lake – due to extremely high water.

YELLOW FLAG ALERT

When a Yellow Flag is in place of the American Flag on the dam, and at the North and South boat docks, this indicates that Holiday Lake is experiencing high levels of Bacteria. Holiday Lake recommends not engaging in water activities.





RECYCLE BIN



The recycle bin is located at the office, inside the fence, and is available during normal business hours. We ask that you do not put your recycle items over the fence, if the gates are shut. Please rinse or wash out cans, plastic and glass.

Please do not place: plastic bags, packing peanuts or trash/garbage in any of the bins.

Only clear glass, no colored glass is to be left in the bin. The BIG bin is available for: clear glass, metal, paper and magazines, and plastics (number one and two). Currently there is a separate bin for **broken down cardboard**.

If unauthorized items continue to be thrown in to the recycle bin, the availability of the recycle bin at Holiday Lake may be discontinued.

POP CAN FUND

All money from the collection of Iowa refundable cans and bottles goes towards the fireworks fund, as well as all donations taken in at the gates during the Holiday Lake 4th of July Celebration. This fund collected \$5,876.54 toward the July 2017 fireworks display.

Please empty all cans and bottles and place them in the designated containers within the pop can building at the lake office. **Only**

Iowa refundable cans and bottles are accepted. Therefore, no tea or water bottles are accepted. Please place these items in the recycle bin for plastics.

Fish Committee:

The fish committee, between May 2016 and March 2017, has stocked 12,225 fish at the cost of \$25,341.50. The range of fish stocked during this time has been largemouth bass, catfish, reed ear sunfish, walleye, grass carp, crappie, small bass, and black crappie. Due to thin unsafe ice this winter, the annual ice tournament fund raiser was canceled. Plans are underway for the poker run scheduled for July 29, 2017. Stress to be aware of the size and number of fish taken out of Holiday Lake making sure catch is within the posted limits.

In the past twelve months, there have been 95 events held at the Community Center, with 18 of them being rentals. The other events included 25 faith based youth gatherings; 17 league nights; 10 lake-wide fundraisers/social events; 3 Celebrations of Life and 22 meetings. We have been averaging 8 events per month.

We continue to hold fundraisers to supplement the rental fees collected to allow us to maintain the quality and standards expected of the Community Center. Fundraisers include the Annual Pancake Breakfast and Bake Sale. These two events raised a total of \$5,254.13. Holiday Lake Apparel 'N More is an on-going fundraiser for the Community Center. Items are available year-round, either in stock or by special pre-paid order. They make great gifts or souvenirs. Stop by the office to see what we have to offer. The Community Center is available to rent year-round, with reservations made up to one year in advance. All reservations are on a first come basis. A deposit and rental fee is due at the time of booking to insure your date is reserved. Deposits will be returned after the event, upon returning the Center to its original condition. The Center is also available on non-reserved weekdays (Monday thru Thursday) for lot owners' use. Just contact the office the day you want to use it. If the Center is available that day, you may check out a key. All we ask, is you clean up and leave the Center the same way you found it.

Water Quality Committee (WQC):

After much research, WQC recommend working with Aquatic Environment Consultants to treat Lake monthly April -August 2017. RIZ trustees voted to support 50% water treatment cost which RIZ is authorized for water quality by the Federal guideline. To have healthy Lake water, more needs to take place than chemically treating water. Every property owner at Holiday Lake, whether lake front or off lake, has a part in contributing to the water quality by having septic systems properly maintained, refrain from raking/blowing leaves and grass clippings into Lake and/or ditches, properly install silt fencing, limit use of fertilizers - weed control products on lawns, and water craft operating effectively.

Such notice must be signed by an authorized officer of the entity owning the lot or by each individual in the case of tenants in common owning the lot. If no written notice has been delivered to the Holiday Lake corporate secretary or if the person named is not present to vote, then a vote may not be cast.
- Absentee ballots will be available at the Holiday Lake Office starting Friday, July 14 to Friday, August 11, 2017, during normal business hours.
